After 3 weeks in hospital they are looking wonderful. Both of them have TB and are being treated. Their bodies can now tolerate formula. Thank you for your part in giving these little ones a chance to live. Though suffering a lot, they had the fight in them for life.

Siblings Sharif and Shamina on bottom left are settling into Welcome Home. The mother and the children were abandoned by the dad. She is poor and unable to provide for them. We will try and work with her to gain an income so that they can be reunited as a family with her providing for their needs. Maybe a business loan??

The new clinic is nearly ready. William is going out for a final inspection with the builder today. We need to build a government standard brick furnace for medical waste to open. It will cost \$15,000. Could you help?
