### Dear Welcome Home Friends and Family,

Reunification is our main goal for the children and their families. Pictured with 3 goats each are six children who have all gone home this past two months with 4 more getting ready to go. These families have been working to have a stable place to

take them home. The goats are for the family to breed to develop a business of a herd that will provide income for the child's school fees when the offspring are sold. They also go home with a Medical Card as we supply their medical care until they are 10 years old. They are also given a Bible, shoes, clothes, mosquito net and a mattress. Our Social Workers will be checking in on them to make sure the reunification is doing well.

There are changes happening within Welcome Home where we are doing a greater amount of work where the desperate need is in the villages. We are trying to meet the need there before it becomes desperate life and death crisis situation.

We will always have the orphanage as we are one of the key homes for children in crisis so that is still very much part of our vision. Thanks to all the faithful help from you all it is running like a well oiled machine. Children and staff are doing well.

We are expecting to open the new Medical Clinic in April. It is from here that we are looking to meet the needs of the children of the surrounding district before they have serious medical problems.

We are equipping the clinic minimally in April as we are looking to equip the place fully through a Humanitarian aid group called C.U.R.E. in Denver. They will come to Uganda, assess our needs, come back to Denver and pack a 40 ft container for us. C.U.R.E. will then come back to Uganda and have it delivered to us from the port in Mombassa Kenya and put in place at the Lwambogo clinic.

I was bemoaning the fact that I thought 40ft was too much when my husband Luke challenged me to go seek the Lord because I was not hearing everything. He was right. The Contents of the 40ft container are from donations given to C.U.R.E. in Denver. That means we are able to get things that I did not dream of when we started the clinic. Things like X-Ray machines, a fully furnished and equipped operating room, with all the surgical instruments needed, everything to equip a sterilizing room next to the operating room, a dental department and lots of other things that are needed.

The 40 ft container delivered costs us \$30,000 for contents that a worth a HUGE amount more.

This has made me realize that we need another small building (?? Cost) for the X-ray department, bigger operating room, dental clinic and buy a 40ft shipping container for storage, and 2 or 3 20 ft

containers for sheds. I will keep you posted on what is happening. I appreciate you journeying with us to serve Ugandan Children.
