Lillian (above) is our mum who works with all the children in the home to help with Child Development. She brings a lot of wonderful activities to each department every day and is greatly loved by all the children. She is also a good sport, as seen above.

I often talk about children admitted with an empty love bank account. Annemie from the Netherlands has been a wonderful example to our staff filling each little heart with love, as she makes 2 trips a year. Thank you Annemie!! Much of Uganda has been raised with very little love. All our staff have really grown into a very loving family who are caring. For example In October one of the mums came across one of our children's biological mothers in a bad way in a pool of blood on the ground with bad injuries on one arm. People were all walking past doing nothing. With her own funds that she could ill afford to give she took her to a clinic to be stitched up. She was still bleeding badly so we had her admitted to hospital overnight and are been continuing her care. Our staff member was reimbursed her funds.

Two of our triplets Loyce and Lisa now 20 years old have left school to become hairdressers. Their sister Laura is still continuing to study at school. They were at the home in 2003 when I arrived in Uganda.

On the right hand side is a little boy at our medical clinic who needs your prayers as he has quite a serious heart condition. As soon as he has more in depth testing done we will send him for treatment.

The ministry trip to Southern Sudan went well. The team is planning to return next year and further encourage the war weary pastors. This trip had a personal sponsor. (No cost to Welcome Home).
