They are all very happy to be working with us and are working well together. They have been treating a large number of children with Malaria and many of the elderly with Bacterial infections. It has been a continued stretch of our faith for God's provision.

In the picture on the bottom right you are seeing the lower leg and foot of a 2 week old baby, the first born to one of the young women I have been able to watch grow up in Lwambogo. Her baby was born with no tibia bone and also with 3 extra toes. Baby is going to have a below knee amputation and when old enough will be fitted with a prosthetic limb. Sadly, mum and baby have been abandoned by the husband so please pray for them. Thankfully they are able to stay with the grandma and receive help from our garden for vegetables.
