Dear Welcome Home Friends and Family,

This is going to be another busy hot month. The rains have not come as normal so this coming season may have poor production for the peasant farmers who rely on their crops for food. Since the rise in the price of petrol in Uganda there has been a large increase in the cost of food. For example Welcome Home's food budget increased by \$350 per week. It is scary to imagine what suffering this increase is going to do to the vulnerable. We have planted a garden to help.

Our social workers are fully back on the ground in the villages and find many very malnourished children that we are working to help. In April I met Paul in the village who is the young boy who had the huge tummy we had to drain fluid out of every 2 weeks. He then became healthy and vibrant for at least a year, then Covid. I was surprised and sad to see him looking so worn out and skinny only to find out just this week that he now has TB and is very malnourished. In April when I was there I arranged for eggs and a cup of milk a day to try and boost his nutrition. I will follow up on his case. For the many that are suffering, mostly the children and the elderly I ask for your prayers and continued support.

June is a busy month for us as we have a dental team working with the village people and our children for the first 2 weeks then mid June have a youth team coming from Michigan, Colorado and Oklahoma with a children and youth crusade planned for the 25th. We appreciate prayer for this and for many to know Christ the Savior.

The bottom right picture is of Nancy our assistant manager. In the past 2 years she lost her son tragically, her father and then in March her young husband died suddenly from a heart attack. She needs our prayers.

Thank you all for your love and support that touches the lives of so many in desperate need.
