Dear Welcome Home Friends and Family,

This past month we have had seven new children into the home and eight go home. It has been a busy time.

Our dear Oscar a special needs Hydrocephalic boy has **moved home!!** He was so excited to have his family around him but also scared. We searched for many years for an American family to adopt him and give him what I thought was best. Then we tried to place him in a very good handicapped children's home in Jinja but they have always been full. It was hard to accept that home to the village was the best for him. All other doors were closed. We will keep an eye on his progress to make sure he is well cared for.

Three young girls whose mother died came from the Island. Dad is an older man with a very large family struggling to try and earn enough to feed them. It has been hard to leave the little ones with no one to look after them while he worked. He copes with his older children but not the three younger ones. Pray for the family and the future of the girls.

The other **four children** came in via Mumma Police. The mother of two has mental health issues wandering the streets with them. It is so traumatic for these little ones. We are searching for any healthy family members who would be willing to care for them. With police help, the family issues of other children are resolved. They are now home.

Finances have been very tight. Will you join us in a search to help find 100 new donors to give \$50 to \$100 each month faithfully? It is expensive to relieve the suffering of the large number of children we touch in the home and out in the villages. We need an increased supply.
