## Dear Welcome Home Friends and Family,

April was busy victorious month for Welcome Home. We had 18 visitors from USA and 2 from Holland along with a volunteer doctor from Belgium and a nurse practitioner from Pennsylvania who helped with the medical clinics in the villages. Part of the big Vineyard team of 16 was another nurse practitioner and a physiotherapist who helped us with Oscar. Dr Mike a Ugandan Orthopedics Specialist volunteered his services to put a cast on Oscar's right leg to help straighten it and a half cast on his right arm. We are striving to get him walking as soon as we can.

This has been a season of very practical provision for which we are extremely thankful. Clothes, quilts, towels, diapers, shoes, toys and mosquito nets and some funds from all the volunteers. Fish and posho and beans from two different Ugandan fisheries. It is such a blessing to have help with our food and other practical needs. Many of the local Indian merchants come on a regular basis with some food supplies for the children, even Ice Cream on Easter Sunday.

An offer of shoes was made to us from US AID. We did not need them for our children so we hired a boot maker to go with one of our village team to very needy schools, villages and other orphanages to measure over 2,700 children for some canvas shoes. We will be a distribution point for them. The measuring continues as there is to be a 2<sup>nd</sup> shipment in October.

We are excited to have Ruudy a local young Ugandan and his wife Becky from the USA join our pastor's training school team headed by Jose and Sol Nunez.

Thank you for your continued love and support that enables us to impact so many needy young lives.
