Dear Welcome Home Friends and Family,

This past month has been busy - teams of 9 from Michigan, 2 from California and 4 from Indiana. We started off with a very fruitful medical clinic in Lwambogo that was helped flow very well because of all the teams help. We saw 732 patients.

Serving in Uganda you have to be prepared to have much joy and much sadness on any given day and sometimes any given hour. This past month has been no exception. The children at the home are happy and very enriched by the ministry of the teams we have had. Our staff also touched. At the same time the team has had their hearts broken by what they have witnessed – several children struggling with malnutrition, a young mother whose husband died in January struggling to keep her 5 children. Saddest of all, a dear little five and a half year old boy who came to us in last stages of lymphoma. He only made it for 4 or 5 days after surgery.

We continue to be your hands extended to Uganda seeking to relieve the suffering especially for the children. Sometimes to help the children we need to help the parents or grandparents.

In the village of Lwambogo this past month a young man of 18 years old took his own life as he was so sick of being hungry all the time. We are looking to help form a youth brick building co-op to help youth like him have a hope and some income. There is plenty of mud and water for bricks.

I want to let you our partners know how much you are appreciated. Without you we are not able to make an impact into the lives of the suffering.
