Dear Welcome Home Friends and Family,

I (Mandy) am still enjoying the above picture so much I decided to share it with you again. Pray for all these little ones as we investigate their future, whether it be returning to the village, extension orphanage or adoption - we just want the best possible future for them. Some of their families who show interest we try and help with small business loans and watch to see how hard they will work over a 6 month period. If they work hard they can provide a future for all their family and school fees for their child. Some do really well and the children thrive. Some don't try hard enough, so they cannot provide a future for the child. Some of the children who have gone home - with us giving a lot of support to the family - have had to return to us because their lives were in jeopardy. Our Social Workers check on the children in the villages to see how they are faring. We do rejoice in the ones that are a success as our goal is to restore children home.

For the adopted children we receive follow up reports (every 6 months until they are 18 years old) sent to us and the Ugandan government. It is wonderful to follow the lives of the children and see the pictures of how they have grown

I hear regularly from one of our "babies" who was adopted to England before 2003. It has been interesting to follow her young life. She now living in Israel and is pictured below left working as a camera woman with her parents ministry.
